

What is Storm Water compliance?

Do you know whether or not your company and facilities need to comply with the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) Storm Water Compliance Regulations? If not, please consider the following questions:

- Do you conduct any wet or dry hose fueling at your facility?
- Do you conduct any (light or heavy) vehicle maintenance at your facility (i.e. oil/transmission/radiator fluid changing)?
- Are any hazardous materials handled on site at your facilities? (Namely the fluids mentioned above?)

If you answered 'Yes' to any of the questions above, then any applicable facilities are required by state law to comply with storm water monitoring. **Failure to comply by these regulations places companies at risk of being fined up to \$10,000 per day.**

By way of our partnership with Network Environmental Systems, Inc. (NES), the California Trucking Association Monitoring Group (CTAMG) provides a proactive, inexpensive, and experienced storm water monitoring program that will keep your company and facilities within storm water compliance as outlined by the SWRCB.
